If You've Officially Lost Your Home in the Spokane Fires

Before hiring a contractor, take time to:

- **Document everything**
- **Inventory your losses**
-  **Contact your insurance company**
-  **Open a P.O. Box or arrange a secure mailing address** to ensure you continue receiving important mail, insurance documents, and bills.
-  **Save all receipts** related to temporary housing, meals, clothing, and other disaster-related expenses.
- **Meet with your insurance adjuster**
- **Carefully vet contractors before signing anything**

♥ **Your home may be gone, but your rights are not.**

Protect yourself before making any major financial decisions.

Drop-In Childcare

Spokane Public Schools will offer a free, emergency drop-in camp for children to assist Nine Mile Falls, Mead, and Spokane Public Schools families impacted by fires. Ages 4 and older are welcome. This is intended to give parents and caregivers impacted by wildfires a safe place for their children while they take a break, run errands, or address other immediate needs.
